ONAKI – Net Zero Plan 2025 (Update)

Date: 25 March 2025

1. Context and Commitment

ONAKI is an Indigenous-owned company with two co-owners and three employees. Despite its small size, the organization recognizes the importance of contributing to climate action. In 2023, ONAKI voluntarily joined Canada's Net Zero Challenge and submitted a preliminary plan. This document represents our 2025 update and continued commitment.

2. Emissions Assessment and Current Practices

ONAKI's greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions are primarily related to:

- Use of computers and electronic equipment (electricity);
- Heating/cooling of the workplace;
- Commuting and work-related travel by team members.

Since 2023, ONAKI has maintained a hybrid work model, minimizing travel. Virtual meetings are prioritized (Teams/Zoom), and energy use remains low thanks to efficient equipment. There is no use of natural gas or industrial activity.

3. Objectives for 2025

For the year 2025, ONAKI sets the following goals:

- Maintain a 50% reduction in work-related travel compared to 2019;
- Reduce electricity consumption by 10% compared to 2023;
- Maintain or improve remote work levels to at least 60% of the work week;
- Encourage active or public transportation for employees.

4. Reduction Strategies

ONAKI will implement the following measures:

- Continue to prioritize virtual meetings;
- Replace aging IT equipment with ENERGY STAR-certified models;
- Promote energy-saving behaviors among staff;
- Monitor electricity use and revise practices as needed.

5. Monitoring and Communication

ONAKI will document its actions and update its results annually. The 2025 report will serve as a basis to adjust future efforts and demonstrate progress toward our environmental goals.
